Criteria for Eligibility

To qualify as a Member of AIMVA you must be of good ethical character and you must:

- a. hold at least a Bachelor degree qualification located at level 7 of the Australian Qualifications Framework, issued by a recognised accrediting authority, as defined by the Office of the Australian Qualifications Framework Council;
- b. have a minimum of 10 years equivalent of full time experience working in the profession in which you have graduated;
- c. have a minimum of 10 years equivalent of full time experience in the Valuation to qualify as a Certified Mineral Valuer;
- d. have a minimum of 5 years equivalent of full time experience in any other Area of Practice for which you may be seeking registration;
- e. have a minimum of six month’s equivalent of full-time experience in that commodity in order to be able to nominate experience in a Commodity as an entry in the Register;
- f. have a minimum of eight weeks equivalent ‘on the ground’ experience in order to nominate experience in a Country as an entry in the Register; and
- g. have had extensive experience (not less than 1 years equivalent) working in that State or Territory in order to nominate experience in an Australian State or Territory as an entry in the Register.

The above information is required to enable AIMVA to include your experience in the indexes made available to potential clients. Your nomination of Areas of Practice, Commodity or Geographical locality experience does not in any way set limits or imply limits on your ability to practice within your areas of competence.

Areas of Practice

To be registered in an Area of Practice, the applicant must have accumulated a minimum of five years equivalent of full time experience in any one Area of Practice claimed. Note that the total number of areas of Competence applied for must not exceed the applicant’s total years of relevant experience divided by five. For example, if an applicant has 18 years total experience, then a maximum of three areas of Competence can be nominated.

For those Areas of Practice requiring a specific qualification, an applicant who does not have a major in that discipline may apply for registration, provided the candidate can satisfy the Board that he or she has sufficient experience in that Area of Practice.

Mine and Mineral Property Valuation

- A qualified Professional in geology, mining, metallurgy, engineering or a similar discipline.
- A minimum of 10 years equivalent of demonstrable full time experience in the economic valuation of a mineral exploration property, a development property or an existing or closed mine.
- Demonstrate competence and best practice in peer recognised valuation methodology as it is customarily applied in the minerals industry.
- Registration in this Area of Practice will qualify you as a *Certified Mineral Valuer*.

Project and/or Company Appraisals and Audits

- A qualified Professional in geology, mining, metallurgy, engineering or a similar discipline.

- Demonstrable experience in the preparation of feasibility studies and/or reviews and technical audits and/or independent expert valuations.

Exploration Property Appraisals

- A qualified Professional that has majored in geology who specialises in the technical assessment and evaluation of exploration and pre-development properties.
- A geologist with sufficiently broad and relevant experience to qualify as the author of a Technical Report on an exploration or pre-development property, as defined in the VALMIN Code (as modified from time to time); and who understand exploration strategy and program management for the relevant mineral(s).

Note: *This Area of Practice does not cover the economic valuation of exploration properties.*

Resource/Reserve Estimation (including Geostatistics)

- A qualified Professional who has majored in geology and who advises on, or who undertakes, reviews of Exploration Results and/or the preparation of Mineral Resource estimates.
- A qualified Profession who has majored in geology and who is sufficiently experienced to contribute to, or in restricted circumstances to undertake, the preparation of Ore Reserve estimates. To undertake or supervise Ore Reserve estimates, he or she must have relevant experience in the estimation, assessment/evaluation of the extraction, treatment, transport and marketing of Ore Reserves and the social and environmental consequences.
- A geostatistician who specialises in Mineral Resource/Ore Reserve estimation.

Project Technical Reviews, Technical Audits and Due Diligence Studies

- A qualified technical Professional having a well rounded understanding and experience in Mineral Resource/Ore Reserve assessment, project planning, design, scheduling, budget preparation, risk management, supporting infrastructure requirements, construction and operations coordination and management.

Project Appraisals with emphasis on mining engineering

- A qualified Professional who has majored in mining engineering with experience in the technical assessment and evaluation of current or closed mining operations and proposed mining developments .

Note: *This Area of Practice does not include the economic valuation of existing and proposed or closed mining operations.*

Project Appraisals with emphasis on mineral processing

- A qualified Professional who has majored in extractive metallurgy with experience in the technical assessment and evaluation of current and proposed mineral treatment operations.
- A qualified Professional who has majored in extractive metallurgy with sufficiently broad and relevant experience to qualify as the author of a Technical Report, as defined in the VALMIN Code, on an exploration property.

Note: *This Area of Practice does not include the economic valuation of existing and proposed metallurgical operations.*

Project Appraisals with emphasis on environmental, heritage & Equator Principles compliance

- A qualified Professional who has majored in environmental science or environmental law, with experience in the technical assessment and evaluation of environmental, heritage and EP compliance in relation to current or closed mining operations and proposed mining developments.

Note: *This Area of Practice does not include the economic valuation of existing and proposed or closed mining operations.*

Ability to act as Expert Witness

- A qualified Professional willing to act as an Expert Witness in the Areas of Practice in which the professional has been accredited forming the basis of the opinion or testimony being proffered and whose knowledge and experience of the specific subject(s) or area(s) of his or her written expert opinion or sworn oral testimony, which is thought to be beyond the comprehension of the average layman.
